

Victorian businessman who set up a hotel at **Bentley Priory**

Archbishop who sold Bentley Priory to King Henry VIII during the Reformation

Probable founder of the 12th century Priory

Nobleman who bought Bentley Priory in 1788 and lived there with his family for 30 years
