The Spitfire, known for its speed and agility, became the iconic aircraft of WW2 with over 20,000 produced.



The large Spitfire stained glass window situated on the left-hand side of the Entrance Hall of Bentley Priory Museum was created to commemorate the 50th Anniversary of the Battle of Britain.

2020 is the 80th Anniversary of the Battle, so why not make your very own paper 'stained glass' **Spitfire Window** to mark the occasion...

Make a Spitfire Window

You will need:

- Coloured paper
- Coloured tissue paper or cellophane
- Scissors
- Glue
- Sticky tac to display



How to make a paper 'stained glass' window:

1. Draw around the Spitfire template on the coloured paper. You can draw other basic shapes/outlines depending on what you want to be in your scene.
2. Cut out the inside of the shapes (You can leave sections of the shapes intact to create different details and effects).



3. Turn the paper over. Stick on small pieces of tissue paper to cover the cut-out shapes/sections.
4. Frame with a different coloured border.



5. Display on your window using sticky tac.
